

How to answer AI questions in job interviews

AI is having a growing impact on how we work, so interviewers are increasingly interested in how you're using it, thinking about it and adapting to the changes it creates.

We asked our Squiggly Careers community what questions about AI they're being asked in interviews to help you prepare, practise and stand out.

Four questions from our Squiggly Community

How do you use AI in your work today?

A strong answer can show practical experience, productivity, judgement and how you combine AI with your own expertise.

To prepare: Think about how you're using AI at work: where are you experimenting, and what's already become part of your everyday?

Where does AI add value in your work and where are its limits?

Your answer can show your understanding of AI's strengths and weaknesses, and your judgement about when it's useful.

To prepare: Start with the purpose of your work: what are you trying to achieve? Then, how does AI help you do it better, and where are its limits?

How do you know when AI is wrong? And how do you increase your confidence in it being right?

This question can test your critical thinking, judgement and how you check and verify AI outputs.

To prepare: Think about how you check AI outputs: do you check the original source or ask another AI tool to critique the answer?

How do you think AI will change this role, team or the way you work?

This question can test your curiosity and strategic thinking. A strong answer considers both the opportunities AI could create and the risks to be aware of.

To prepare: Think across different time horizons: how could AI change the role today, in the next six months and in the next 1–5 years?

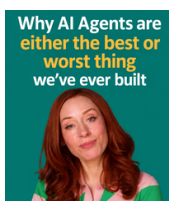
